### **Minister's Letter**

Summer is usually a great time for sport. For some it is a chance to play outdoor bowling, cricket or tennis, to sail, to walk



or climb. For some it is a chance to watch sporting events, either in person or on television. As well as the usual Wimbledon, Epsom, Ascot and cricket matches, this summer also sees the Euros, the open Golf Championship at Troon, and the Olympics in Paris at the end of July.

The Olympics are designed to be an opportunity for the world to come together and be united in the fun and challenge of sport. However, as we know, the competition is not just between sportsmen and women, but between countries large and small whose leaders try to score points against each other over the number of medals won. Some are quite prepared to break rules to ensure that their person or team wins.

The modern Olympics are, of course, based on a competition held regularly in ancient Greece, but as we have a number of other sporting competitions alongside the Olympics, so it was in ancient Greece. Among these was the Isthmian Games, held near Corinth, which attracted large crowds of spectators and competitors.

Paul would have been very aware of the Games from his visits to Corinth, and may have been there while they were happening. He is described as making a living by being a tent-maker, and it is quite probable that many of his tents were designed to provide accommodation for those attending the Games. He uses sporting analogies in his letters to the Corinthians, the Philippians and to Timothy. Like sportsmen and women, he encouraged the followers of Jesus to strive for the highest standards and goals – in how we live our lives, in what we want our community and world to be like. Like sportsmen and women, we are part of a team too, there to help and be helped by each other. Unlike sports people we do not rely on the help of a good, human coach but on the teaching and example of Jesus, the presence of the Risen Jesus with us everywhere we go, and the power of the Holy Spirit to guide and empower us through all life's challenges.

Whatever you do or watch, have a good summer.

## News from the Foodbank



Bags given out in first quarter



We've just completed the first quarter of 2024 and we looked back to 2021 to create the above chart which makes for sobering reading. The year-on-year percentage increase in bags distributed can be clearly seen from the bar chart but the overall increase between 2021 and 2024 is an astonishing 164%.

In the current quarter, we've helped almost 10K adults and children by dispensing more than 4K basic bags of food. These figures include approximately 250 adults and children who report never having been to a food bank before.

Monday 22nd April we again broke our record when we gave out 106 basic bags in a single 2-hour period, passing our previous grim record of 98 back in January of this year.

### **SJR Walking Group**

The walking group's first outing of 2024 was an interesting route

from the city centre down to the Clyde, led by John McFadyen. Starting at the impressive viewpoint in Hill Street, Garnethill, we crossed over the M8 to Charing Cross, and headed along Woodside Place and Clairmont Gardens to Kelvingrove Park. After carrying out a thorough survey of the Stewart Fountain, a coffee stop was called for, which was ably supplied by the friendly staff in the Art Galleries.



Suitably refreshed and having decided to leave an exploration of the new university campus on the old Western Infirmary site



for another day, the group followed the route of the Kelvin to the Riverside Museum, where we caught a glimpse of the new bridge being built over to Govan. From here, the final leg took the group to Glasgow Harbour, with views across the Clyde to the construction of HMS Cardiff at BAE Systems and some final inspection at Andy Scott's sculpture 'Rise'.

With plenty of interesting architecture, history and change to

experience, plus good company and glorious weather, the scene was set for a very enjoyable outing.

Our next adventure, on Saturday 8th June,



keeps us in Glasgow, this time crossing the new Sighthill Bridge over the M8 from the city centre, then following a route along the Forth & Clyde Canal from the Pinkston Watersports Centre back to Kelvindale. The route takes in a number of interesting new developments designed to add to the amenity value of the canal. Have you met 'Bella' yet??!

The walk is just over 4 miles long, and level with the exception of a gradual incline from Buchanan Street Bus Station to reach the new bridge. If a shorter walk is preferred, there are plenty of options to leave the walk and pick up public transport back home.

### **Summer Reading**

The Secret of Elephants by Vasundra Tailor (Lake Union Publishing, available on Amazon)

I am taking up the challenge posed last month by Wilma Murphy to recommend to other readers a book I have enjoyed.

I have to confess the author of my family saga nomination Vasundra Tailor is a friend of fifty years. We met at Indian dancing when she was a post graduate pharmacy student at Strathclyde University.



Firstly, The Secret of Elephants is a good read reflecting Vasu's own background in both Zimbabwe and India. Quickly drawn in, I wanted to keep reading.

The story concerns a member of the Indian diaspora in Zimbabwe who has long been intrigued by hazy family connections in the subcontinent. When she makes a visit, the long-hidden secrets come to the surface and she understands why.

I liked the short chapters, each very much a story in itself. With an instalment's length often crafted with 'what happens next' I readily returned next day.

At times moving, laced with heartbreaking family tragedy, family ties not what they tell the world, true love evaporated by arranged marriage ... or is it? The Secret of Elephants will enhance your summer reading.
