

A Shocker from the Foodbank



The graph shows the number of people helped in the first 16 weeks of the year, comparing 2021/2022/2023. As you can see **the number has almost doubled between 2021 and 2023**. We have calculated that each bag is now worth £10, reflecting our huge rise in costs associated with the 'cost of living crisis'. Alongside this we are increasing the nutritional value of what we're offering. Each bag offered now includes fresh fruit and veg, eggs and cheese and extra protein – meat or fish – which is paid for from donations.



About St Gregory's Food Bank

St Gregory's Food Bank is an independent food bank operating five mornings a week from the Chapel of St Gregory's RC Church in Wyndford, Maryhill.

We provide a range of grocery and store cupboard items with household cleaning and personal hygiene items available on request to the most vulnerable in society. No referral is required, meaning anyone can access support.

As we are blessed with the use of Fr Cameron's presbytery, we have no overheads: no rent, and no heating bills. The food bank is staffed entirely by a dedicated team of volunteers which means there are no staffing costs.

This means that every penny donated to the food bank goes directly to those in need.

How You Can Help

If you wish to assist the Foodbank, donations can be sent to the office for the attention of Mary Glassford, Asst Treasurer, or handed in on a Sunday to anyone on duty.

If you wish to donate regularly you can set up a standing order, same bank sorting code and account details as for normal giving, but please put Foodbank as the reference.

A box also sits in the East Vestibule for donations of food, toiletries, empty egg cartons and jam jars.






