Minister's Letter

doing between June and September.
Meanwhile the Kirk Session, Leadership
Team and Nominating Committee of St
John's Renfield have been busy
progressing the search for a new minister.



At the time at which I am writing this, and

when you will receive the completed Beacon, no one outside the Nominating Committee knows whether anyone has responded to the advertisement, and applied to be considered as our minister. Only the members of the Nominating Committee know, and they will keep quiet about it until a formal recommendation of Sole Nominee is made. We keep praying for them and for the work they are doing.

It will be good to have a new minister to lead us forward as we try to fulfil God's will for us over the coming years as his church in our part of Glasgow, with all the challenges ahead. We must remember, however, that the new minister is there to 'lead us', and should not to be left to do all the work him or herself.

God calls all of us to be involved in his work of building the Kingdom – sharing his love and his Good News. Many of us grew up in a world with a very different attitude to the church, to God and to faith. We cannot put the clock back and try to do things as we did 70, 50 or even 30 years ago, but we can acknowledge that many (neighbours, colleagues or complete strangers) still have a 'spiritual' dimension', and many feel burdened by the pressures of Twenty First Century

life. The love and Good News of Jesus are still as relevant for people today as they were when the Apostles first went out to share them.

Jesus is calling us – led by our new minister – to carry on the task he first entrusted to Peter, Andrew and the others all those years ago. Let's be ready to respond with energy and enthusiasm to his invitation to do so.



Blazing Blankets

Your Editor's jaw dropped when he entered Kelvin West parish Church.

He had been inside before – principally in his school days; marched whither, in file, for a term-closing service.

The overarching memory is boredom. Even the quality woodwork, in best Presbyterian manner, was the same

wherever his eye strayed. No danger of the congregation wandering from the Word of the Lord.

Now the pews were on fire with colours, usually wild colours, everywhere he looked. Different combinations in every pew and differing combinations from one end to the pew's other. Upstairs and down.

Gathered in Kelvinside West were the magnificent outpourings from knitting needles and crochet hooks of those who had responded to the joint initiative of Glasgow

Presbytery and The Lodging House Mission. Squares crafted by Churches, Community Groups and individuals had been sewn together into hundreds of blankets – 575 in mid-September with more promised.

A wonderful effort, with St John's Renfield involved, perfectly timed for distribution through The Lodging House Mission to people experiencing homelessness and isolation across the city this winter.

SJR Walking Group August Adventure

August saw the group (of 14) head out closer to home to walk along the River Clyde from Stockwell St to the Riverside Museum, a distance of 3 miles. Inspiration for this route came from the Glasgow's Clyde Bridges Trail leaflet produced by the Institute of Civil Engineers (ICE), which Roddy came across on



his travels (https://www.ice.org.uk/download-centre/glasgows-clyde-bridges-civil-engineering-trail).



To suit our bus travel requirements and desired distance, we skipped the section in Glasgow Green, starting instead from Victoria Bridge. As someone who hadn't walked along the riverside through town in years, much has changed, but even for those who had, all spotted things not seen before. Most notable were the inscriptions piers of the redundant on two Caledonian Railway Bridge by artist and writer Ian Hamilton Finlay (not in the leaflet!), remnants of the elevation system for the **Finnieston** old Ferry

(<u>www.theglasgowstory.com/image/?inum=TGSW00044</u>), a 2nd Spanish Civil War memorial and 50th anniversary memorials to those lost in the 1960 Cheapside St fire.

An impromptu coffee stop was made in the Hilton Garden Inn beside the Finniestion Crane, before some intrigue at the soon-to-start charity zip line on waste ground between the Clydeside Distillery (old

Pumphouse at Queen's Dock) and the Riverside Museum. Attempts to bribe Mr McFadyen into signing up proved futile!

Our next walk will be on Saturday 11th October 2025, destination TBC. As always, all welcome.


